Restorative Justice Building a Habitat Home

Ridge View Academy, Rite of Passage (ROP) Carpentry students had the wonderful opportunity to "give back to the community" through meaningful restorative justice. This past spring, ROP students framed the walls for Jacob's Home-to-be at their school woodshop in Watkins, CO. The walls were loaded on a flatbed truck bound for the San Luis Valley. Five students joined their instructors and came to work with our staff, volunteers, and Jacob to raise the walls and to set roof trusses. ROP instructor Rich Gruber said,"Working with these students every day of the week has been a transformative experience. Teaching the craft of homebuilding to a group of young men at such a critical point in their lives, is truly an honor and a privilege. The enthusiasm these young men display in their desire to learn this trade gives me great hope in both their future as productive citizens and in the building trades.'

Ridge View Academy has provided residential services to male adolescents since 2001. The Carpentry curriculum is a complete overview of all aspects of the carpentry trade. Our Habitat Project provided an opportunity for the students to read and interpret blueprints, learn basic job-site and shop safety, tool safety and usage, site layout, building, design and execution. The job site work furthered the experience as the students raised, straightened and braced the walls, and set the roof trusses. The project provided a foundation for students to continue on a pathway to a construction career by giving the students real job-site experience as well as the satisfaction of seeing the tangible and positive results of building a home with people in need. In the words of ROP student Lantz, "It was amazing. I got to experience what it's really like to be on a job site and construct an actual house. It was a pleasure working with the recipients of the home. They were very happy and grateful and their smiling faces showed that they really appreciated our work."
