Rite of Passage Carpentry Trades at Ridge View Academy

LaTara's home is being built in partnership with an amazing carpenter apprenticeship program. This spring, Rite of Passage (ROP) students at Ridge View Academy will frame the walls for LaTara's Home-to-be at their school woodshop in Watkins, CO. The project will teach the craft of homebuilding to a group of young men at such a critical point in their lives.

Ridge View Academy has provided residential services to male adolescents since 2001. The Carpentry Curriculum is a complete overview of all aspects of the carpentry trade. Working with our Habitat Project will provide an opportunity for the students to read and interpret blueprints, learn basic job-site and shop safety, tool safety and usage, site layout, building, design and execution. When the walls are complete, ROP students will join their instructors and work with our Habitat Staff & volunteers to raise the walls and to set roof trusses on site. The project will provide a foundation for ROP students to continue on a pathway to a construction career by giving students real job-site experience as well as seeing the tangible results of building a home with folks who might not have thought it possible to own a home.

We are soooooo excited for this next building venture! Funding for the ROP project is all made possible through Ridge View Academy, Southern Colorado Community Foundation and the Anschutz Family Foundation.
